### MAN'S PATH TO GOD

The human being, in the measure in which he comes to consciousness of the Divine Reality which he carries in himself, proceeds to make for himself an intellectual image of that Reality and begins to adore it outside of himself, converting it into his God: the only true GOD, in whom he attains the Unity with the Being who "IS," and his Realization in Him.

According to the degree of evolution and the state of consciousness in which we find ourselves, so is the Image and concept which we make for ourselves of the God whom we adore; in this way the different Religions were born....

When we begin to come to consciousness of God outside ourselves, we see him as Creator, and to Him we attribute all Creation; later on we progressively proceed to relate to Him all the actions of our life until we attain a consciousness of Him in ourselves. This is what was realized in the People of Israel, culminating with the *manifestation* of that last state of consciousness in Jesus, the Christ. This is the "pilgrimage" of man towards his Divine Reality, pilgrimage which is exemplified in the People of Israel and is contained in the Holy Scriptures, the Bible, Old and New Testament.

### THE PATH OF RENUNCIATION AND RELIGIONS

The different religions pursue the same end: the spiritual "Realization" of man, the unity of man with his Being, He who "IS." It is the "forms" that separate man from the end which Religion pursues. Those "forms" affirm the collective ego; this is a re-affirmation of the individual ego. Only those who deny themselves may prescind from the forms and adore God in Spirit and in truth; they are the ones who attain the Unity and are God's Only Begotten Son.

Only he who has renounced himself may help another.

Just as the eye could not see any color if it had a color of its own, also the intellect must be empty of all forms to be capable of understanding them all.

Our "knowing" is not like God's, a "creative act," but an "interior receiving" which "immerses" us in the Being, the unique who "IS." This is the realization, not only of man but of all Religion "in" man: *God all in all*.

«He who lives detached, who abandons all desires, and who has no notion whatsoever of "I" and "mine," attains peace. Oh Partha, this is the state of establishment in Brahma, which when reached, no more illusions are left. Even when that state is attained at the moment of death, man reaches Brahma-Nirvana; he identifies himself with the supreme.»
